In Nepal we find very many other sacred sites, which spiritual pilgrims should see:

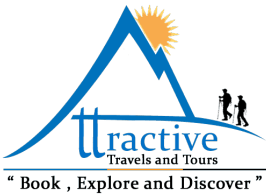
- **Gosainkunda Lake:** This is a Holy lake in the Himalayas that holds a mythological significance to Hindus.

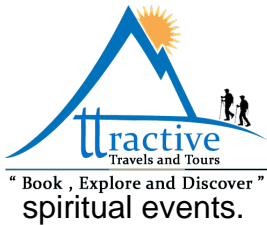
