1. Kathmandu Durbar Square

- **Highlights:** Whitewashed dome, Buddha eyes, and playful resident monkeys.

5. Boudhanath Stupa

As one of the largest global stupas, Boudhanath forms the spiritual heart of Tibetan Buddhism. Additionally, pilgrims continuously circle the massive white structure. **Thus,** this Kathmandu UNESCO heritage site provides an atmosphere of pure serenity.

- **Highlights:** Giant mandala shape, prayer wheels, and rooftop cafes.

6. Pashupatinath Temple

Located along the Bagmati River, Pashupatinath is Nepal's holiest Hindu site. Although non-Hindus cannot enter the main temple, visitors can explore outer grounds. Meanwhile, this Kathmandu UNESCO heritage site hosts the mesmerizing evening Aarati ceremony.

- **Highlights:** Cremation ghats, holy shrines, and the evening Aarati ceremony.

7. Changu Narayan Temple



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Perched on a high hill, Changu Narayan stands as Nepal's most ancient temple. Built around 400 CE, it features striking stone sculptures. Indeed, this Kathmandu UNESCO heritage site concludes the architectural tour splendidly.

- **Highlights:** Ancient stone carvings, Vishnu statues, and panoramic views.
