Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: Does this flight touch down at Mount Everest's base camp?

It does, indeed. From the Kalapatthar vantage point, you can see Mount Everest and other adjacent peaks the best. You will undoubtedly touch down at the 5545-meter-high Kalapatthar. Everyone wants to touch down at Kalapatthar and Base Camp, but Base Camp landing depends on how quickly the wind blows. Landslides can force the EBC landing location to disappear. You won't be able to view Mount Everest from Base Camp so that you know. The pilots approach base camp and Everest as closely as they can in case they cannot land.

Q: How high does the [Everest Base Camp Heli Tour](#) travel?



The elevation of Kathmandu, the capital of Nepal, is 1300 meters. The aircraft takes off from Kathmandu and land at the 2,830-meter-high Lukla Airport for refuelling. Once you reach Hotel

Everest View (3800 meters), you can continue to Kalapatthar and Everest Base Camp, both located at 5545 and 5364 meters, respectively. Near Mt. Everest, the chopper performs a "rounding flight," which could involve flying above 6300 meters.

Q: Is it possible to develop Acute Mountain Sickness (AMS) when taking the heli tour to Everest Base Camp?

You are unlikely to have acute mountain sickness (AMS), also called altitude sickness, during this adventure because of the strict safety procedures in place.

First, assistance will be provided if you become ill due to being at a high altitude. You will either be transported to a lower altitude location or to Kathmandu if your illness worsens. After that, more treatment will be administered if necessary.
