2026 Permit Rules & Cost Breakdown (UPDATED)

Recently, the Nepal Government officially abolished the old rule that required a mandatory 10-day flat fee of \$500 for the **Upper Mustang Trek**. Specifically, this historic change shifted the policy to a flexible daily rate. As a result, shorter treks, jeep tours, and cultural visits are significantly more flexible and affordable.

Furthermore, under updated regulations, solo travelers can now obtain permits, though you must still be accompanied by a licensed Nepali guide from a registered agency.

Required Permits (2026 Rates)

- **Restricted Area Permit (RAP):** Most notably, the fee is now a flexible **\$50 USD per person, per day**. Therefore, you only pay for the exact number of days you spend inside the restricted zone.
- **Annapurna Conservation Area Permit (ACAP):** In addition, this permit is required for transit through the Annapurna region, costing **3,000 NPR (approx. \$22–\$25 USD)** for foreign nationals.
- **TIMS Card:** Similarly, this card costs approx. **\$10–\$20 USD**. *Note: However, the TIMS requirement is often waived if you fly both into and out of Jomsom without traveling overland.*
